for the opening of a new exhibit featuring the Churches of Hartford with stunning examples of workmanship, style and unique architecture. A church is more than a building so we include the founding history, important people and events that mark changes in society like the impact of war, temperance, slavery and the emergence of the Ladies Aid Society.

In the permanent collection, the main building features the development of industry and advancement of colonial life in the Villages of Hartford. The Enlistment Center showcases the enlisted man 3000 mile journey of the 123rd Regiment of Company E NYS Volunteers as they marched from Hartford to Salem to board a train and fight in the Battle of Gettysburg. The collection concentrates on the men, their equipment, their stories and the battles.
